The Village of Homewood's TreeShare Program offers its residents a chance to purchase selected trees and **plant them anywhere on their property** (private or parkway), as long as there are no utility conflicts involved.

The Village splits the cost with the purchasing resident, thus **giving residents a savings of 50%**. The Village will deliver to your parkway, free of charge, with planting instructions attached. We are sorry, but the Village cannot plant the trees for you.

To order, view the details of the trees on the following pages, fill out the order form in the back and bring to the Village Hall. **Orders will be taken until Saturday, March 29th, 2014.**

Residents may purchase up to 2 trees.



Black Haw Viburnum

Resident Cost: \$47




Being offered as a single stem, this small tree to large shrub is often grown as an accent plant in an informal hedge, as well as to soften the hard lines of structures around the home landscape. Beautiful flowers, clean foliage and a wonderful fall color is realized with this plant, and in winter, the 90 degree branch structure adds to the texture of the landscape. As a habitat plant, few are better than Black Haw, this plant may be perfect for under power lines, on the parkway where no site line issues may occur, or near the foundation. 18 feet tall by wide.

Excellent private property tree, good for the parkway.

Bur Oak

Resident Cost: \$62




Often found throughout the Village, Bur Oak is a grandiose tree that offers excellent growth of three feet a year once established. Dark green leaves in summer, turn a decent yellow-brown in fall. This native grows 70 to 80 feet high and wide and is extremely adaptable to many growing conditions and sites. Ideal for shade either in the home landscape or on the parkway, this tree will be a lasting legacy for future generations.

Dawn Redwood

Resident Cost: \$62



Thought to be extinct as of 1941, this tree was found in a secluded valley of China. Brought into cultivation in the late 1940's, this tree has gained prominence for its outstanding attributes. The habit is distinctly pyramidal in youth and old age and can reach heights of up to 70 to 100 feet, while reaching a width of 25 feet. Bright green needles turn a beautiful orange-brown to russet brown in fall. Similar appearance to an evergreen, but this conifer loses its leaves come fall. This tree can survive in both dry and moist soils, requires full sun however is a wonderful selection for parkway and home landscapes.

Eastern White Pine

Resident Cost: \$42




This wonderful native tree was once common throughout the Chicago region. One of our most beautiful native pines, this tree is without equal compared with firs, spruces and other pines. Caution should be used while planting this tree, as mature height is often 50 to 80 feet by 30 feet wide. Often used as a screen or as a buffer to northern, as well as westerly winds, this tree offers quiet elegance to the home landscape. Not recommended for foundation planting, wet locations or near roadways.

Excellent private property. Not for the parkway

Hill's Oak

Resident Cost: \$62






A wonderful native to our county, Hill's oak is often found on well drained dry clayey or sandy soils. Mature height is 60' and perhaps 45' wide, offering a fantastic option for a shade tree in the home landscape, or even planted on the parkway if there are no over head conflicts. Fall color is a beautiful red to reddish-orange, and will brighten the landscape for generations to come.

Excellent private property and parkway tree.

Katsura Tree

Resident Cost: \$50



Understated elegance is the best way to describe this wonderful tree. Habit is pyramidal in youth, more rounded with maturity. The young leaves emerge a beautiful bronzy-purple, fading to light green and then blue green with summer. Fall color is rich hues of yellow to apricot with the spicy scent of cotton candy as leaves senesce. This tree, while requiring ample amounts of water in youth matures into a superb species with little or no insect or disease problems. Mature height and spread is 40 to 60 feet.

Excellent tree for the home landscape.

Korean Maple

Resident Cost: \$77





Korean Maple, often called Purplebloom, is a beautiful tree with tremendous fall color ranging from orange to red in most cases. This tree displays four seasons of interest with purple samaras in summer, delicate green leaves, rough brown bark with brick red branches, and a picturesque silhouette in winter. In addition to all these attributes, it is extremely cold hardy, being able to survive the harsh winters in Minnesota, yet remains content in our region as well. Perfect for planting under power lines, as an accent to the home landscape, or limited clearance areas on the parkway. 20 feet tall at maturity, 15 to 18 feet wide.

Excellent private property tree. OK for parkway.

Peking Tree Lilac

Resident Cost: \$55




A tough plant for many difficult situations, this small tree or large shrub can attain a height of 18 feet tall by as many feet wide in the home landscape. Disease resistant, this plant does not sucker has showy pure white paniced flowers, with mildly peeling bark of cinnamon coloration. A wonderful accent plant, this tree will provide three seasons of interest, and can be considered for parkway as well as home landscape projects.

Excellent private property tree and good parkway tree.

Shumard Oak

Resident Cost: \$67



Shumard Oak is a fantastic native tree often found in areas of periodic flooding, yet tolerates drought in most cases. High soil pH is often scoffed at by this tree, and can be found in soils higher than 7.5 which can be found in Homewood. Bright red fall color follows the rich green of summer on a tree that can achieve 85 feet in height, by 60 feet wide, making this one very large exclamation point in the landscape. A legacy tree, this is one for multiple generations to enjoy, but not for under power lines, nor within close proximity to the home.
