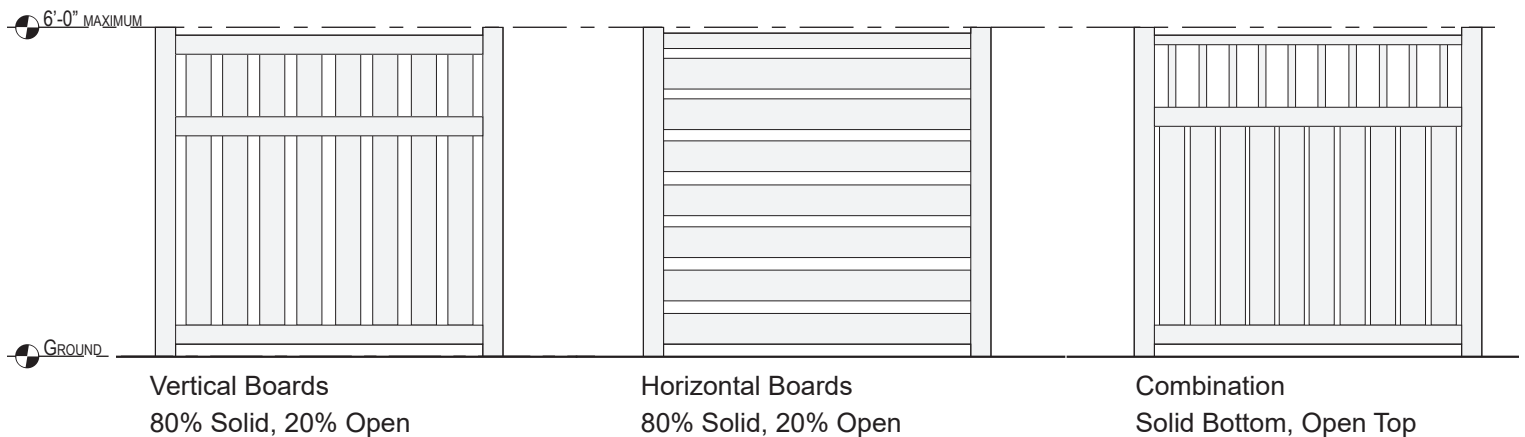


Exterior Side Yard Fence Planning Guide

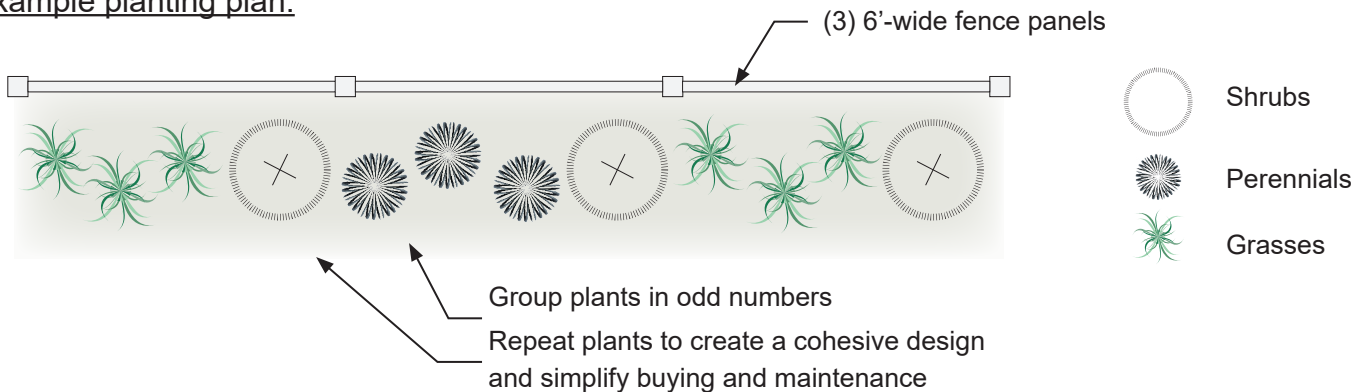
Requirements:

- Fence may be a maximum of 6'-0" tall.
- Fence may be a maximum 80% solid. *See examples below.*
- Locate the fence a minimum 3'-0" from the property line and plant shrubs, native grasses, and perennials to cover 75% of the planting bed along the full length of the fence fronting the street.

Planting Tips:

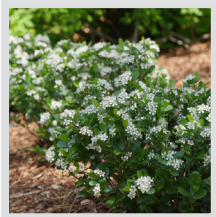
- Choose plants hardy to **Zone 7**.
- Native plants may be harder to find at the local home improvement stores, but will require less maintenance over time. Check at the local nursery for more varieties
- Be sure to check the anticipated mature size of your plants - do not select ones that grow larger than 6 feet.
- Select plants based on anticipated hours of sunlight and maintenance.
- Always plant odd numbers of the same plant.
- Generally, space shrubs 2' - 4' on center, or as directed per the planting instructions.
- Generally, space grasses and perennials 18" - 24" on center, or as directed per the planting instructions.
